Round 5 - Shakespeare's Comedies

You will be given two clues to a Shakespeare play — the first is the setting and the main characters, and the second is an outline of the plot. Can you name the play? 3 points if you name the play after 1 clue. 1 point if you name the play after 2 clues.

If you answer incorrectly at any stage, you get no points, and it becomes a pass. For a pass, you will get both clues, and a correct answer will score 1 point.

1a)

Setting: Comedy set in and around the Forest of Arden; Characters include Frederick, Celia, Rosalind, Orlando and Oliver.

Plot: Frederick has usurped his brother's dukedom: Rosalind disguises herself as a boy called Ganymede, Oliver is attacked by a lion, Rosalind marries Orlando.

Answer: As You Like It

1b)

Setting: Comedy set in Navarre, France; Characters include Ferdinand, King of Navarre, Dull, the constable, and Costard the clown.

Plot: Ferdinand has resolved to abstain from the company of women for three years. When the King of France arrives with his daughter and three ladies-in-waiting, Ferdinand falls in love with the Princess. When the King of France dies, the Princess has to return home, and vows to return to Ferdinand in a year's time.

Answer: Love's Labour Lost

2a)

Setting: Comedy set in Vienna; Characters include Vincentio, Duke of Vienna, Angelo, his deputy. Claudio, Juliet and Isabella.

Plot: Vincentio disguises himself as Friar Lodowick to see how Angelo manages the harsh morality laws. Claudio is condemned to die for getting Juliet pregnant before their wedding. His sister, Isabella, is a nun who tries to help Claudio, saying that she would give her life for him, but not her virginity. Vincentio is moved by this, frees Claudio and restores freedom to Vienna.

Answer: Measure For Measure

2b)

Setting: Comedy set in Messina; Characters include Leonato, Don Pedro, Claudio and Benedick, Hero and Beatrice.

Plot:Claudio falls in love with Leonato's daughter, Hero, but Don Pedro's jealous brother plans to spoil the wedding. Benedick falls in love with Beatrice. A servant girl is disguised as Hero to make Claudio think she is unfaithful, but after much confusion, the two couples are wed.

Answer: Much Ado About Nothing

3a)

Setting: Comedy set in Illyria; Characters include Orsino, Olivia, Sir Toby Belch, Malvolio, Viola and Sebastian

Plot: Orsino is in love with Olivia. Viola and Sebastian are shipwrecked. Viola thinks her twin brother is dead, and disguises herself as a man to become page to Orsino. But Sebastian is alive, and arrives in Illyria. After much confusion, Orsino marries Viola and Sebastian marries Olivia.

Answer: Twelfth Night

3b)

Setting: Comedy set on a lonely island; Characters include Prospero, his daughter Miranda, Caliban and Ariel.

Plot: Prospero and Miranda have been cast away on the lonely island by Prospero's brother Antonio. By using magic, Propsero brings Antonio to the island along with the King of Naples. Miranda falls in love with the King's son; the wrecked ship is magically restored, and they all return to Milan and Naples, with Prospero restored as the rightful Duke of Milan.

Answer: The Tempest

4a)

Setting: Comedy set in Athens; Characters include Theseus, King of Athens, Hippolyta, Hermia, Lysander, Oberon and Titania

Plot: Hermia wants to marry Lysander, against her father's will. They flee to a wood inhabited by fairies, where Oberon and Titania are involved in a quarrel. Oberon gets a potion from Puck, to make Titania fall in love with the first creature she sees on waking. After a series of mistakes and mischances, Oberon is left to perform a spell which will ensure a happy ending.

Answer: A Midsummer NIght's Dream

4b)

Setting: Comedy set in Ephesus; Characters include twins who are both called Antipholus, and their father Aegeon

Plot: The twins have been separated early in life by a shipwreck. One goes to live with his father in Syracuse, and when he becomes a man he sets out to find his brother. Antipholus of Syracuse arrives in Ephesus just as his father has been arrested and condemned to death. However, his lost brotherjust happens to live in Ephesus, and after much confusion, their father is freed and the twins are reunited.

Answer: The Comedy Of Errors

Spare:

Setting: Comedy set in England; Characters include Sir John Falstaff, Mistresses Ford and Page. Nym and Bardolph

Plot: Falstaff tries to get hold of the money which Mistresses Ford and Page control. The ladies play a series of tricks on Falstaff, who hides amongst the dirty linen, is thrown into the mud, and beaten by Mistress Ford whilst in disguise as Mrs Prat.

Answer: The Merry Wives Of Windsor
