Round 1 - Food & Drink

- 1b:** What is the term used to describe a container for providing a hot water bath to keep cooked food hot? A **bain-marie**
- 2a:** Other than sugar, name the main ingredient in Zablagione. **Egg yolks**
- 2b:** What is the name of the sweet pastry made from layers of fillo pastry, often with nuts and honey, popular in the Balkans and Greece? **Baklava**
- 3a:** Which Michelin 3-star chef has recently featured in an advert for Knorr stock cubes? **Marco Pierre White**
- 3b:** "*The Lighter Way To Enjoy Chocolate*" is the slogan associated with which chocolate treat? **Maltesers**
- 4a:** What cocktail can be made from the following: rum, Curaçao liqueur and lime juice? **Mai Tai**
- 4b:** What cocktail can be made from the following: vodka, Galliano liqueur and orange juice? **Harvey Wallbanger**

3a: From the film: Whose picture appears on a US \$100 bill? **Benjamin Franklin**

3b: From the film: Which cricketer recorded the most first-class centuries? Jack **Hobbs**

4a: From the film: In the Alexander Dumas book "The Three Musketeers", two of the Musketeers are called Athos and Porthos. What is the name of the third Musketeer?
Aramis

4b: From the film: Who invented the first commercially-successful revolver? Samuel **Colt**

Spare: What is the name of the lead character in the film, who is seen answering the questions on the quiz show? Jamal **Malik**

- 1b:** As one of the first, and probably best known, selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors, what was the commercial name given to the drug fluoxetine by its originators, Eli Lilly, when it was launched in the mid 80's? **Prozac**
- 2a:** The products Larium and Malerone are marketed for the prevention and treatment of which tropical disease? **Malaria**
- 2b:** Acetylsalicylic acid, first isolated by Felix Hoffmann in 1897, is better known by what name? **Aspirin**
- 3a:** What is the name of the anticoagulant, originally marketed in 1948 as a pesticide against rats and mice, often prescribed to reduce the risk of blood clotting? **Warfarin**
- 3b:** In 1796, Edward Jenner developed the first vaccine when he discovered that immunity to smallpox could be produced by purposely infecting a person with which closely related, but significantly less harmful virus? **Cowpox**
- 4a:** Which group of anti-bacterial compounds, with variants such as V and G, were fortuitously discovered on Friday 28th September 1928? **Penicillins**
- 4b:** Which commonly used, over-the-counter painkiller can be extracted from poppies and takes its name from the Greek for poppy head? **Codeine**

3a: Who was Road Runner's arch enemy? He used absurdly complex contraptions to try and catch the Road Runner. **Wile E. Coyote**

3b: Who was Bugs Bunny's arch enemy? He was a big game hunter with a double-barrelled shotgun going "*Hunting Wabbits*". **Elmer J. Fudd** (Accept **Elmer Fudd**)

4a: Who was Captain Pugwash's arch enemy? He was also a pirate, the captain of "The Flying Dustman". **Cut-Throat Jake**
