**2a**. American Rhythm & Blues singer, died penniless in 1984 aged 49 and buried in an unmarked grave. Fans raised money for a proper burial and in 1990 his remains were moved to Wayne, Michigan.

# A. Jackie Wilson

**2b**. American country singer, died in 1998 of a blood clot at the age of 55. Her daughters filed a wrongful death lawsuit in 1999 against her doctor. On exhumation the autopsy concluded she died of cardiac arrhythmia. She was reburied in her mausoleum in Nashville,

## A. Tammy Wynette

**3a**. English Pre-Raphaelite artist's model, died in 1862 aged 32. Buried in Highgate Cemetery, exhumed in 1869 so that husband Dante Gabrielle Rossetti could retrieve original poetry manuscripts from her coffin.

A. Elizabeth Siddal – accept Lizzie Siddal

**3b**. Argentine President, died in 1974 aged 78. In 1987 his tomb was desecrated and his body mutilated. His severed hands were held for a ransom of \$8 million.

A. Juan Peron

**4a**. Convicted of the A6 Murder and hanged in 1962 aged 25, this criminal has been exhumed twice. First from prison grounds in 1966; then from a cemetery in 2001 for DNA tests which established his guilt.

A. James Hanratty

**4b**. American 'rat-pack' singer and musician; died 1990 aged 64. Exhumed by his wife to retrieve the \$70,000 worth of jewellery buried with him when it was discovered he died bankrupt.

**2a**. Cremated at Mortlake Crematorium, actor from Carlton in Nottinghamshire, 1947 – 1979, who appeared in the 1970s TV sitcoms "*The Lovers*" and "*Rising Damp*".

#### A. Richard Beckinsale

**2b**. Cremated at Golders Green Crematorium, actor and composer from Cardiff, 1893 - 1951 who wrote the musical "*Glamorous Night*". His memorial is a lilac bush.

### A. Ivor Novello

**3a**. Buried in the Jewish Cemetery at Golders Green, celebrated cellist from Oxford, 1945 – 1987, her performing career was ended by multiple sclerosis.

## A. Jacqueline Du Pre

**3b**. Buried in East Sheen Cemetery, TV and film actor from Wigan, 1934 – 1988, who died after falling off a horse whilst filming "The Return of the Musketeers" in Spain, he also appeared in "Taste the Blood of Dracula" and "Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory".

## A. Roy Kinnear

**4a**. Cremated at Golders Green Crematorium, English comedy actor born in South Africa, 1913 – 1976, appeared in 19 of the Carry On films.

#### A. Sid James

**4b**. Cremated at Golders Green Crematorium, English comedy actress from London, 1927 – 1980, discovered by Joan Littlewood and best known for her TV sitcom role of Mildred Roper.

### A. Yootha Joyce

#### **Spares**

Buried in St Pancras and Islington Cemetery, English Pre-Raphaelite artist born in France, 1821 – 1893, he painted "*The Manchester Murals*" for Manchester Town Hall. **A. Ford Madox Brown** 

Buried in Gunnersbury Cemetery, film director from London, 1906 – 1976, he won the academy award for best director in 1968 for "*Oliver!*". He also directed "*The Third Man*" in 1949 and "*The Agony and the Ecstasy*" in 1965.
