Required answers are in bold capitals.

ROUND ONE: SAINTS

1a. One of the first followers of St. Francis of Assisi, this saint founded the Order of the Poor Ladies early in the 13th century. Name her. St. **CLARE** (or **CHIARA**)

1b. Because of his former occupation as a tax collector, he is the patron saint of bankers and accountants. Name him. St. **MATTHEW**

2a. In which city was Joan of Arc executed in 1431? **ROUEN**

2b. Name the Basque priest who founded the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in 1540.
St. **IGNATIUS** of **LOYOLA**

3a. This saint is said to have founded Glasgow and is the city's patron saint. Name him. St. **MUNGO** (or **KENTIGERN**)

3b. Name the patron saint of Edinburgh, whose cathedral, also known as the High Kirk of Edinburgh, stands in the Royal Mile. St. **GILES**

4a. This saint is the mother of the Virgin Mary in apocryphal and Islamic traditions. Name her. St. **ANNE**

4b. Name the Irish missionary saint who founded the abbey of Iona and is credited with spreading Christianity in Scotland. St. **COLUMBA** (or **COLM CILLE**)

Spare: Name the former soldier in the Roman army who became Bishop of Tours in 371 and was one of the first non-martyrs to be venerated as a saint. St. **MARTIN**

ROUND TWO: PATRICKS AND PATRICIAS

Identify the following Patricks and Patricias (who may not all be best known by their full first name).

1a. This actor starred in the TV series *Danger Man* and *The Prisoner*, for which he also wrote several episodes and was the executive producer. Patrick **McGOOHAN**

1b. This actor starred in the films *Dirty Dancing* (1987), *Ghost* (1990) and *Point Break* (1991). Patrick **SWAYZE**

2a. This writer is best known for the Aubrey-Maturin series of novels, starting with *Master and Commander* in 1969. Patrick **O'BRIAN**

2b. This French writer won the Nobel Prize in Literature in 2014. His works include *Dora Bruder* (1997), translated into English as *The Search Warrant*, and the memoir *Pedigree* (2004). Patrick **MODIANO**

3a. This actress, born in 1929, is best known for her role as Hyacinth Bucket in the BBC comedy series *Keeping Up Appearances*. Patricia **ROUTLEDGE**

3b. This actress, born in 1923, came to fame playing Elsie Tanner in *Coronation Street* from 1960 to 1973 and again from 1976 to 1984. Pat **PHOENIX**

4a. American crime writer best known for a series of novels featuring Dr Kay Scarpetta, a medical examiner. Patricia **CORNWELL**

4b. American novelist best known for her psychological thrillers, including *Strangers on a Train* (1950) and *The Talented Mr Ripley* (1955). Patricia **HIGHSMITH**

Spares:

(Patrick) This teacher, poet and political activist was one of the leaders of the 1916 Easter Rising and among those executed in Kilmainham Gaol in May of that year.

Patrick **PEARSE**

(Patricia) American singer and writer whose first album was *Horses* (1975) and who won the National Book Award for her 2010 memoir *Just Kids*. Patti **SMITH**

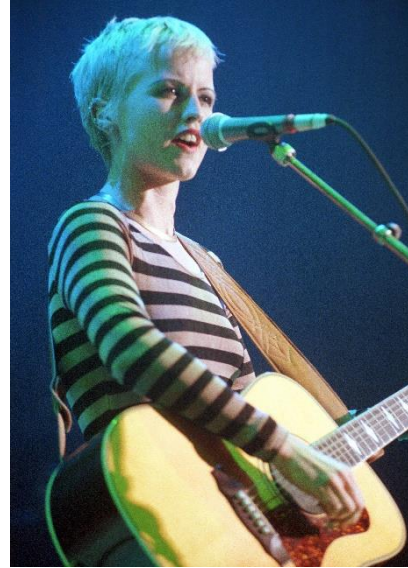
