## Round 1: - Bits...: - All answers contain the word "bit".

- 1a: What are defined as any of a class of organic compounds which used to be regularly prescribed for anxiety, depression and insomnia in pill form. They have now almost entirely been replaced.
  Barbiturates
- **1b:** Defined on the NHS website as an inflammation of a vein near the surface of the skin. It's not usually serious and often gets better on its own after 1 or 2 weeks. **Phlebitis**
- 2a: Name the rebellions in Scotland mainly in the C18<sup>th</sup> seeking the restoration of the Stuart dynasty and the tourist steam hauled train which runs between Fort William and Mallaig? The <u>Jacobite</u>
- **2b:** A drink popular in the 1980s, usually served in a pint glass and comprises equal parts of lager and cider. Also the nickname of the Scottish darts player, Peter Wright. <u>Snakebite</u>
- **3a:** Name the 1980s BBC children's television show about an alien magician, which starred the TV and stage magician Paul Daniels and his assistant Debbie McGee. <u>Wizbit</u>.
- **3b:** What name was given to an ancient measure of length, approximately equal to the length of a forearm? Noah's Ark was 300 of these units long, 50 wide, and 30 high. <u>Cubit</u>
- **4a:** Which computer file format, with the file extension .bmp, contains uncompressed data, making it ideal for storing and displaying high-quality digital images. *Bitmap*
- **4b:** Name the BBC flagship website which provides educationally approved, curriculum relevant self-study and home-learning to 5-16 year olds. BBC <u>*Bitesize*</u>

**Spare:** Name the class of extinct marine arthropods, one of the earliest groups of arthropods to appear in the fossil record, they were among the most successful of all early animals, existing in oceans for almost 270 million years. **Trilobites**

- **3a:** <u>American Singer</u>: Her songs include "*The First Time Ever I Saw Your Face*" and "*Killing Me* Softly with His Song". <u>Roberta Flack</u>
- **3b:** <u>UK TV Character</u>: Holliday Grainger plays which character in the BBC detective series *"Strike"*? <u>Robin Ellacott</u>

**4a:** <u>American actress</u>: Played *Jenny* in *"Forrest Gump"* and *Buttercup* in *"The Princess Bride"*. <u>Robin Wright</u>

- 4b:
   British Actress: Played Eleven in "Stranger Things" and Enola Holmes in the "Enola Holmes" film series.

- Spare: <u>Scottish Dog</u>: Name the Skye Terrier, famous for his loyalty to his owner, who stayed by his grave for 14 years in Edinburgh. <u>Greyfriars Bobby</u>

**Spare:** Founded in the 17<sup>th</sup> Century making it one of the UK's oldest functioning companies. What is the surname of the founder of this removal company? <u>Pickford</u>
