<u>The Queen</u>

1a) The son of a lead investigator in the 1932 Lindbergh baby kidnapping case, he became a United States Army General and led the coalition forces in the Gulf War during Operation Desert Storm

NORMAN SCHWARZKOPF

1b) A member of a leading political family in the USA, he was known as 'The Lion of the Senate' and unsuccessfully sought the Democratic nomination for president in 1980 but was always haunted by a tragic death in 1969

EDWARD **KENNEDY**

Head of a US law enforcement agency for 48 years until his death in 1972, he later became a controversial figure when evidence of his secretive abuses of power became known J EGDAR <u>HOOVER</u>

2b) A US general who officially accepted the surrender of Japan in WW2, he was in charge of the UN forces in the Korean War but was controversially removed from command by President Truman

DOUGLAS MACARTHUR

3a) Mayor of New York at the time of the September 11 terrorist attack in 2001, he received his knighthood for his leadership afterwards. He has since acted as one of Donald Trump's personal lawyers

RUDOLPH **GIULIANI**

- 3b) As US Special Envoy, he took a leading role in peace negotiations in Northern Ireland, and was a primary architect of the the 1998 Good Friday Agreement for which he was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize. GEORGE J **MITCHELL**
- 4a) An American film director who was one of the pioneers of the New Hollywood era, he has won two Oscars and is the highest grossing director of all time STEVEN <u>SPIELBERG</u>
- 4b) He has won Oscars for both Best Actor and Best Supporting Actor and was artistic director at The Old Vic Theatre in London from 2003 to 2015
 KEVIN SPACEY

<u>Spare:</u> A drop out from Harvard, he built a business empire and claims to have paid more taxes than anyone else ever. He is now well known for his philanthropy. His wife Melinda was made an honorary dame in 2013.
